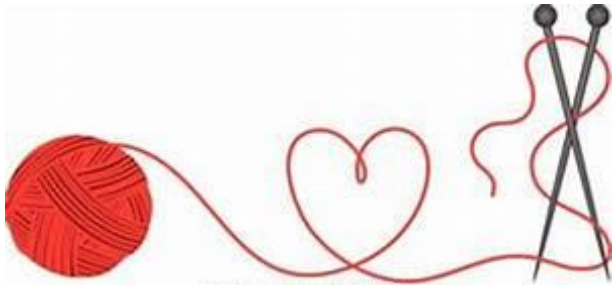

Charge Conference Highlights by Jeff James

The sanctuary of Mt Olivet was filled for Charge Conference on December 14th. Our District Superintendent, Rev Dr. Kyung Hee-Sa, presided over a gathering of sixteen churches. Many attendees actually came early and were blessed to be treated to breakfast in our Fellowship Hall. Bill Whitaker and a band of Methodist Men rolled out the “Radical Hospitality” and got the

Conference off to a great start. I had the blessing of sitting with Dan Henderson, Pastor Gary Meekins from Mt Calvary and Pastor Jake Macklin from Gethsemane. It’s always great to be with Jake since I can remember when he was a caterpillar on a Chrysalis weekend and now a UMC Pastor! I have a special affection for Rev. Meekins since he ministered in song during the Service of Remembrance at the 2018 Annual Conference, which my family attended in honor of my father in law, the late Rev. William “Bill” Dore.

Everyone was interested to learn how this ‘new’ way of conducting charge conference was going to go since we had so many churches participating. I was really excited, because I am a big fan of the Connector Group concept. As the Ambassador of Love INC, I have been blessed to preach, pray, sing, or just be present at most of the United Methodist Churches in Seaford, Bridgeville, and Greenwood. I have suggested the District Superintendent just start calling them “Circuits” especially since our history goes back to the very garden of Methodism in America. The Conference went very well and we made a note of several opportunities for improvement for the future. Dr. Sa was especially appreciative of the level of laity participation. The pastors of the Sussex Northwest Connector Group had structured the program so that we had breakout sessions to connect with one another. I had the blessing of leading a breakout group on Missions. The other groups included:

Youth, Worship, Discipleship, and Stewardship.

Each group was tasked to conduct discussions considering three questions:

- 1. What’s God Doing?**
- 2. How do we get on board?**
- 3. What is our shared ministry?**

Dr. Sa joined our breakout group and we had a great discussion. Mt Olivet’s very own, Susan Kent, Executive Director of Love INC of Mid-Delmarva also participated and it was a great pleasure for me to discuss our churches’ shared ministry, especially since Susan is at the core of so much of it. We also talked about Cherokee Missions and the connections between Mt Olivet and Union in Bridgeville. Above all, we were charged up considering the potential of what we might be able to do together. Dr. Sa wrote in the January issue of the Dover District Newsletter that she was very excited that our Charge Conference considered getting together as a group in the spring to get on board with what God is doing in Seaford, Bridgeville, and Greenwood. Furthermore, many of us will be attending the Impactful Service workshop on January 18th. Mt Olivet will be hosting this Dover District Strategic Leadership Team event and I look forward to sharing some highlights with you.



Online giving is available for most of the common types of giving. You may designate money to go to the operating budget or other fund. You may pay for bulletin covers or flowers just to name a few. It is easy to use and it is safe. Instructions on how to set up an account can be found at Mt Olivet's web site: www.mountolivetseaford.org. Click **online Giving**, click on **HERE** in step 1.

Your e-mail account is used as your online giving username. Don't want to set up an account? You can do Quick Give which takes you directly to a one-time giving form. Online giving accepts debit cards, check cards, Visa, or Master Card. Why use online giving? Maybe all your other giving is done online. You can set up recurring amounts so that your contribution is given at the frequency that you choose. Maybe you are going on vacation or are unable to attend. An easy way to make sure your tithe still gets to Mount Olivet is to use online giving. The options are very flexible. Let's say you want to give \$200 to the Good Samaritan Fund. You can set up a recurring amount of \$20 per month for 10 months to happen on the 5th of the month. Donations given online will be noted on your quarterly statements the same as offering donations. December 2019 Treasurer's Report



For the month of December, we received contributions of \$26,480 and we spent \$25,680 giving us a **positive balance for the month of \$800**. The total **deficit year to date** is still high at **\$23,898**. The Finance Committee, in consultation with the Church Council, is beginning a process to refocus and to tie the budget closely to realistic giving estimates for our 2021 budget year. We anticipate that we will need a full year to do that work effectively and prayerfully, recognizing that we cannot continue to absorb budget deficits. We also anticipate that aligning our budget with our mission and outreach will yield a rich harvest, as scripture promises us.

Our contributions for the month were above average for December. Expenses were above the budget for December by only \$1,112. Staff is paid every 2 weeks, for a total of 26 pay periods, so twice each year we end up with a month that has three payrolls. December was a 3 payroll period in 2019.

Don't forget you can make your contribution online, directly from your card or account. Go to our website, www.mountolivetseaford.org, and select "Give" to set up your contribution, either a onetime gift, or as a regular deduction. Please give prayerfully so we can keep our deficit down for 2020 as we look toward 2021.

WAYS TO VOLUNTEER DURING THE CODE PURPLE SEASON

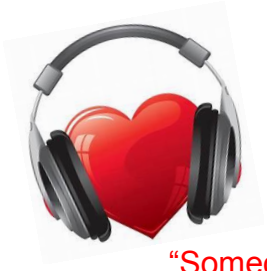
1. Staying overnight at one of our shelters.

8. Tutoring for GED preparation. (CROSS Building)
9. Help with jobs skills, life skills, resumes, applications, etc. (CROSS Building)
10. Donations of food, paper products, and toiletries.
11. Prayer.
12. Discipleship - learn about Love INC TEAM Ministries.

that this can occur from normal vibrations from walking/running/building movement. While that's good news, we thought it would also be a good idea to share some information regarding fire alarm, security, and other emergencies occasionally throughout the year in the Messenger. Since we've had issues related to the fire alarm, we thought that might be the best place to start!

We want to remind everyone that when the fire alarm sounds, everyone should immediately exit the building through the nearest accessible exit. There are maps in each room showing the location of all exits and the nearest emergency exit route. Keep in mind that the nearest exit may be blocked and you may have to locate an alternate exit. Everyone should gather in the southwest corner of the parking lot (the corner by Cannon street nearest the river). We want to be sure to be out of the way of arriving emergency responders and away from the main road. Once evacuated, please follow all instructions provided by the Trustees or Pastor Christine and do not re-enter the building until an all-clear has been provided. If you have any questions, please reach out to one of the Trustees.

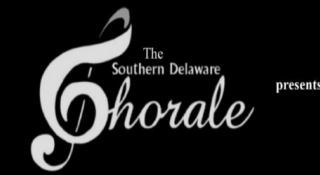
