See the place where they laid him. ⁷ But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you." Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid.

Season of



The word "epiphany," from the Greek word epiphania means appearance or manifestation. The arrival of these visitors was a sign that the incarnation of God in Christ had been made known and was recognized by the heavens to the whole world, so that even Gentile wise men from the East came to pay him homage. The **season** of **Epiphany**

concludes with the light of Transfiguration Sunday as the eternal presence of God shines through Jesus as witnessed by Peter, John, and James (Matthew 17:1-13, Mark 9:2-8, Luke 9:28-36). During **Epiphany**, followers of Jesus consider what it means to live with the light of Jesus shining through their lives.

Season of Lent

The season is a preparation for celebrating Easter. Historically, **Lent** began as a period **of** fasting and preparation for baptism by converts and then became a time for penance by all Christians. Lent is a season of forty days,

not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word lencten, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring.

Season of Easter



Easter for Christians is not just one day - it's a 50-day period. The season of Easter, or Eastertide, begins at **sunset** on **the eve of Easter** and ends on **Pentecost**, the day we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church (see Acts 2).
